- Communication and Language
- Physical development
- Personal, Social and Emotional development















Within the EYFS, there are **7 areas of learning and development**

4 specific areas, to strengthen, build upon and apply learning:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive arts and design














Rainbows

Characteristics of effective learning:

- Playing and exploring (have a go)
- Active learning (keep trying)
- •Creating and thinking critically (making links and problem solve)







- A mixture of adult focused and child initiated tasks
- Indoor and outdoor environments to reflect 7 areas
- Topic based focus, providing new experiences









Structured lessons to have directed teaching time during the day followed up by small group work

- Daily Maths sessions using White Rose programme
- Daily Communication, Language & Literacy (phonics)
- RE (following The Way, The Truth and The Life and Come and See Catholic scheme)
- Weekly PE lesson (focus on gross and fine motor skills)







Key person:

- Each child is allocated a named member of the Rainbows team
- To help the children settle, build relationships and for staff to develop knowledge of each child's needs

Learning journeys & observations:

- Record achievements, learning and next steps
- Online observation platform using Tapestry
- Parental contributions and information from home encouraged!

Speech and Language support

 Language Link- offering speech and language support where needed. Focus of understanding of use of language.



Ways to help your child before they start school

- Talk about going to school, including saying goodbye, wearing a uniform, staying for lunch, playtime etc.
- Encourage their independence with dressing and using the toilet.
- Focusing on nursery activities, such as listening to stories, singing nursery rhymes and number songs and using a variety of language as they are playing.
- Open mornings Monday 21st and 28th November to see us in practice!

- Contact with local nurseries to visit all the children and their current key workers
- 'Listen Play and Sing' informal weekly groups during 2nd Summer half-term
- 1 full day induction in July 2023
