
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Dear Parents and Carers,

SPOTLIGHT ON YEAR 5

Ocean Class (Year 5) have been working hard in all subjects. Most recently in maths, using their times table knowledge to multiply and divide using the formal written method. They greatly enjoyed studying our class texts 'Shackleton's Journey', 'Secrets of the Sun King' and 'A midsummer night's dream' and are currently exploring the anthology 'I am not a label' in reading lessons.

In science we have been learning all about different materials. We have looked at material properties, thermal conductivity (including an investigation into how to keep my cup of tea hot!) and the solubility of a range of different materials. We have been able to do lots of hands-on investigations, developing our working scientifically skills such as predicting, observing, measuring and recording.

Our last DT unit was based around developing a recipe and making our own Bolognese sauces. We began our project learning about the process of beef production, then researched a tradition recipe and made changes to it. We had to add nutritional value by selecting ingredients and practise a range of food preparation skills including cutting using the claw grip, peeling, pressing and measuring. We used these skills to make our final sauces.

Our last geography unit was based around mountains. We found out how mountains are formed, where we can find them around the world and studied a variety of maps, including relief maps, showing the height of the land. Did you know, in 1991, the body of a man was found high up the Alps. The body was over 5,000 years old and had been preserved in the ice! He was named Otzi, and scientists were able to find out many things about his life.

In computing we have been using databases to search and sort data, creating a class database and databases on our chosen topics. After adding at least 8 database records, with 6 fields of data, we wrote and answered questions about each other's databases.

This term we have started our swimming lessons at Fore Street, demonstrating confidence and determination to learn this vital life-long skill.

Our last Art topic was Sculpture and 3D, focusing on installation art. We studied the work of Cai Guo-Qiang, known for creating explosion installation artworks, before creating our own small-scale explosion style installations, using paint, glitter, crushed chalk and powder. We also worked in groups to plan and create large-scale installation artworks, using everyday objects. Our chosen themes included World War bunkers, Big Ben, The Afterlife and A beast in a bed.
