Ocean class – Harrison for being such an enthusiastic member of the class, especially in geography and history.


Mountain class – Ernest - for making fantastic progress recently, particularly in his mathematics.

#### Wizz

You may or may not be aware of a relatively new app called Wizz which has suddenly jumped up in the popularity charts. This app was similar to Omegle (which no longer exists); it connected users to other random users for one-to-one chat and was causing considerable concern in relation to abuse/extortion. Thankfully, after being contacted by NCMEC (National Center for Missing and Exploited Children), both Apple and Google have removed Wizz from their app download stores. It is now no longer available, however the app is still operating so users who previously downloaded can still use it. Therefore, your children may be using this app - it is definitely worth checking.


